The present petition for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner Amit Kumar who is in judicial custody since 14.02.2026 in connection with Kotwali P. S. Case No.94/2026 registered for the offences punishable U/ss 25(1-A), 25 (1-B) (a), 26, 35 Arms Act.

Prosecution case, in brief, as per written report of the informant Dhananjay Kumar Singh, SHO of Kotwali Police Station is that on 13.02.2026 at about 20:00 Hrs., he got secret information that conversation of sale and purchase of arms and ammunition is being done between two persons namely Anil Rawani @ Tiger and Amit Kumar Singh at Golbagicha Gabra Par. After getting this information, at about 20:10 Hrs, the informant along with other police officials reached at the said place where two persons after seeing the police party tried to flee but they got apprehended on the spot. After intensive interrogation, they disclosed their name Anil Rawani @ Tiger and Amit Kumar Singh and further accused/petitioner Amit Kumar told that Alakh Niranjana Singh had purchased 96 live cartridges Rs.42,500/- and sold them to accused

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Anil Rawani @ Tiger on a consideration amount of Rs.42,500/-. After further interrogation, Anil Rawani @ Tiger allegedly confessed that he had concealed the cartridges at his residence. Thereafter, the police party proceeded to his house and conducted a search in presence of witnesses. During search, the police party recovered 96 live cartridges bearing marking “25 HPM 32” from a plastic container concealed inside a room of the house. On being asked about the document related to recovered live cartridges, the accused Anil Rawani did not produce any paper. Further, the recovered live cartridges were seized and seizure list was prepared accordingly.

Ld. counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated in this case. He also submits that there is no specific allegation of overt act against the petitioner. Ld. counsel further submits that nothing has been recovered from the possession of this petitioner rather the recovery of said live cartridges has been made from the house of accused Anil Rawani @ Tiger who has been granted bail by this court vide order dated 18.04.2026 passed in B.P No.661/2026 and the case of this petitioner stands on better footing. He further submits that petitioner having no criminal antecedent is lying in judicial custody since 14.02.2026.

Ld. P. P. has also been heard in opposition.

I have considered the aforesaid submissions and have perused the trial court record. The petitioner is named in the FIR with allegation that

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he is said to be indulged in trading of arms and ammunition. After further perusal of case record, it is found that chargesheet has been submitted in this case and cognizance has been taken on 05.05.2026 against this petitioner along with other co-accused persons.

Considering the aforesaid submissions, particularly the submission that petitioner having no criminal antecedent is lying in judicial custody since 14.02.2026, he is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned.
