The present petition for regular bail has been filed on behalf of petitioner Rasid Miya who is in judicial custody since 29.03.2026 in connection with Khizersarai P.S Case No.120/2026 registered for the offences punishable under sections 96, 3(5) of the BNS.

Prosecution case, in brief, as per written report of the informant Radha Devi is that on 25.03.2026 at about 11:00 A.M., the accused/petitioner enticed her daughter namely Chandani Kumari and kidnapped her with the help of other accused persons.

Ld. counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the informant's daughter had intimate relationship with the petitioner and on account of love affairs between them, the informant's daughter joined the company of this petitioner. He further submits that the factum of love affairs between the petitioner and informant's daughter was not known to the informant and in that background, the present case was got registered. Ld. counsel further submits that chargesheet has been submitted in this case and petitioner is lying in judicial custody since 29.03.2026. He further submits that petitioner carries no criminal antecedent.

I have considered the submissions as advanced by the parties and have

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perused the materials available on the TCR and have also gone through the statement of the victim recorded under Section 164 of the Cr.P.C. corresponding to Section 183 of the BNSS in which she has nothing stated against this petitioner rather has stated that on account of love affair, she joined this petitioner and nothing wrong has been done by the petitioner to the victim. Further, chargesheet has been submitted in this case. As per para-28 of the case diary, the informant and victim has given written application to the Medical Officer that victim does not intend for medical examination. The petitioner having no criminal antecedent is lying in judicial custody since 29.03.2026.

Considering the aforesaid and period of custody, the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the court concerned.
