The present petition for anticipatory bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner Rajesh Yadav @ Rajesh Kumar apprehending his arrest in connection with Magadh Medical P.S. Case No. 270/2025 registered for the offences punishable under sections 126(2), 127(2), 115(2), 110, 352, 351(2) and 3(5) of the NS

The prosecution story as per the informant in brief is that on 31.08.2025 at about 10:30 p.m. when the informant was present near the emergency gate of Magadh Medical College, the accused-petitioner along with one Sunil Yadav arrived and assaulted him. It is further alleged that the accused persons forcibly made the informant sit in their Tavera ambulance and took him near the jungle near Cherki Road, where they assaulted him with the butt of a pistol, causing him injury on his head. Thereafter, the snatched away a sum of R.2,000/- from the informant and threatened him with dire consequences. Subsequently, the accused persons took him to another place, left him there and fled away.

Ld. counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and has falsely been implicated in this case.

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He further submits that all the sections as alleged are bailable in nature except section 110 of the BNS which has been added to make the case more serious. He further submits that the allegations are general and omnibus in nature.

Ld. counsel further submits that the incident took place on 31.08.2025 and the FIR has been lodged on 17.09.2025 after an unexplained delay. He further submits that the petitioner carries some criminal antecedents for which a supplementary petition has also been filed. He further submits that during the course of free fight, some minor injuries might have been sustained but there was absolutely no intention to cause death or to cause any significant injury.

Ld. P.P. has also been heard in opposition to the prayer for bail.

I have considered the submissions as advanced by the parties and have perused the case record along with the case diary. Upon perusal of the case diary, it appears that the petitioner is named in the FIR with the allegation that he has assaulted the informant due to which he sustained head injury. Upon perusal of the case diary, more specifically Para 31, the injury appears to be simple in nature caused by hard and blunt substance.

In view of the aforesaid facts and circumstances, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is hereby **allowed**. It is directed that the petitioner in the event of arrest or surrender before

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the court concerned within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order, the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of **Rs.25,000/-** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the court concerned with condition as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
