The present petition for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioners Ramsundar Singh Bhogat and Baleshwar Singh Bhogta who are in judicial custody since 11.05.2026 in connection with Chhakarbandha P.S. Case No. 03/2026 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 8(ii), 18(ii), 27(ii) and 29 of the N.D.P.S. Act.

The prosecution story in brief as per the informant, Sintu Kumar, Forest Officer is that acting under the directions of superior officers, he conducted raids along with forest officers and other officials on four different dates namely 06.01.2026, 07.01.2026, 13.01.2026, 09.02.2026 over forest and non-forest lands. During these operations, opium plants were destroyed over 05.06 acres of forest land and 08.44 acres of non-forest land. On each date, contraband opium plants were recovered in the following quantities:

06.01.2026- 274 grams

07.01.2026- 392 grams

13.01.2026- 405 grams

09.02.2026-280 grams

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On enquiry regarding the cultivation, on the condition of anonymity, the villagers disclosed, that the accused-petitioners along with others were involved in the illicit cultivation of opium plants.

Ld. counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are innocent and have falsely been implicated due to village politics. He further submits that the petitioners have no concern with the cultivation of Opium plants. He further contends that the petitioners have been languishing in jail since 11.05.2026 and the petitioners carry no criminal antecedents.

Ld. counsel further submits that on the condition of anonymity, the name of this petitioners have been referred to in the FIR which makes it highly doubtful and not free from malice. He further submits that neither Khata nor plot no. is mentioned in the FIR and no incriminating article has been recovered from the physical possession of these petitioners. He further contends that other co-accused namely Ashok Singh Bhokta has been granted bail by this Court vide order dated 08.04.2026 passed in Bail Spl. Act 1128/2026, hence on the basis of parity, the prayer for bail of this petitioner may also be considered favourably.

Ld. Spl. P.P. has also been heard in opposition.

Taking note of the aforesaid submissions, particularly the submission that the petitioners have been in judicial custody since 11.05.2026 and carries no criminal antecedents and also in view of the order passed in Bail Spl. Act 1128/2026, dated 08.04.2026 granting bail

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to the co-accused, the prayer for bail of these petitioners is hereby **allowed**. The petitioners are directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of **Rs. 25,000/-** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned.
