ORDER

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1. The present anticipatory bail petition has been filed and pressed today for order on behalf of above named petitioners who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Delha P.S. Case No.183 of 2026 for committing offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 74, 75, 76, 351(2), 352, 3(5) of BNS, pending in the court of Learned C.J.M.,Gaya.
 2. Heard Learned Advocate for the petitioners and Learned A.P.P. for the State.
 3. This present case has been instituted by the written information given by the informant namely Revi Kumari and she married with Prabhat Kumar and alleged that all named FIR persons harass the informant and they are not ready to live informant in her maternal home. Her husband is a teacher in a private school. On 27.06.2026 at about 06:30 A.M. when her husband moved for school then the all named FIR persons got unclothed and thereafter all of them brutally assaulted they tried to outrage the modesty even by touching her private parts and the video recording of the said occurrence is possessed with the informant. Hence this case.
 4. The Learned defence counsel humbly submitted that the petitioners have not filed any bail either anticipatory or regular bail petition before this Court or any Hon'ble higher Court. Further he submitted that petitioners are quite innocent and have falsely been implicated in this case. He further stated that informant is a lady with bear nose and she never likes the other family members and more particularly she always pokes her husband not to share his monthly salary to anyone, other than herself. Lastly, he submitted that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent, so the petitioners may be given the privilege of anticipatory bail.
 5. The Learned A.P.P. opposed the prayer and prayed to dismiss the petition of bail filed by the petitioners.
 6. Heard Learned Counsels for both the sides and perused the case record along with case diary. From perusal of case record, it transpires that, present case has been registered for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 74, 75, 76, 351(2), 352, 3(5) of BNS against the present petitioners. Notice was issued to the informant, however, she did not appear, despite several opportunities afforded to her. All the petitioners are in-laws of the informant, who resides in

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the same house. Offence alleged against the petitioners are not punishable with more than 3 years of imprisonment. Further, allegation of Sections 74, 75 and 76 of BNS is general in nature against all accused, including female also. From perusal of Para No.3 of bail petition as well as Para No.30 of case diary, it transpires that present petitioners have no criminal antecedent.

7. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case as discussed above the nature of allegation against the petitioners, I find it proper to enlarge the petitioners on bail. Let the above named petitioners are directed to be released on bail in the event of arrest or surrender before the court below, within a period of 01 month from the date of receipt of this order on furnishing of bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount with conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of BNSS. Subject to the condition is that the petitioners are directed to duly and regularly appear before the concerned Court on the dates of hearing fixed. It is, however, made clear that any observation made herein shall not be treated as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
