The present petition for anticipatory bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner Upendra Singh apprehending his arrest in connection with Mufassil P.S. Case No. 299/2019 registered for the offences punishable under sections 341, 323, 504, 506 and 498(A) of the IPC.

Ld. counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner happens to be the husband of the informant and the marriage between them was solemnized in the year 2007 and owing to some petty issues, some altercation took place between the parties resulting in institution of this case.

Ld. counsel further submits that the informant has developed some misconception that the petitioner has entered into a second marriage. He further contends that the informant has some greed and she is interested in acquiring the petitioner's property and she is ready to join the petitioner only on the condition that the petitioner transfers some portion of his property to her.

Ld. counsel further contends that during the course of investigation, the petitioner was extended protection in terms of

section 41(A) of the Cr.P.C. and he has fully cooperated with the IO during the course of investigation.

Ld. counsel further submits that subsequently charge-sheet was submitted and thereafter cognizance was taken vide order dated 07.01.2021 and thereafter bailable warrant was issued followed by a non-bailable warrant against this petitioner. He further submits that the petitioner recently came to know about issuance of the NBW when the police visited his house in compliance of the same.

Ld. counsel further submits that apprehending that once the petitioner appears before the Court concerned, he may be taken into custody, he has approached this Court for grant of protection.

The petitioner Upendra Singh along with his wife Rajni Kumari is present before this Court.

On the previous date also both the parties were present before the Court and steps for conciliation were taken. However, no positive outcome was observed and accordingly, as a second opportunity, today also efforts have again been made to resolve the matrimonial discord between the parties.

Today, Ld. P.P. interacted with both the parties and upon query, the petitioner expressed his willingness to keep his wife with full honour and dignity but the informant refused to accompany the petitioner stating that she would only join if the petitioner transfers some portion of property to her.

Ld. P.P. has opposed the prayer for bail.

It is directed that the petitioner in the event of arrest or surrender before the court concerned within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order, the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of **Rs.25,000/-** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the court concerned with condition as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
