1. This anticipatory bail application has been filed on behalf of above named accused petitioners, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Atri P.S. Case No. 342 of 2024 registered for the offences under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 110, 303(2), 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S.
2. Sri Kailash Ray, the learned counsel has appeared to move this anticipatory bail prayer. The prosecution is represented by the Addl. Public Prosecutor.
3. The learned defence counsel has submitted that the accused petitioners are quite innocent, have committed no offence as alleged by the prosecution. There is no any specific allegation made against the petitioners. On these grounds a prayer has been made for grant of Anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners.
4. The case of prosecution based on written application of informant, in brief is that, on 04.09.2024 at about 9:00 AM, accused persons named in the F.I.R. attacked the house of informant armed with lathi and rod. Accused Anuj Kumar armed with a rifle assaulted the informant by the butt of rifle causing his left hand injury. It is further alleged that all the accused persons assaulted his wife and snatched the gold chain and earring from his wife.
5. Heard the Ld. A.P.P. and the Ld. Counsel of defence and perused the case record. From perusal of the case diary and injury report, it transpires that no injury found on the vital part of the body of informant. No criminal antecedent has been found against the accused petitioners.

6. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners. If the accused petitioners appear before the learned original court within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of the order to the trial court, he shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial court with the statutory conditions particularized u/s 482 (2) of the B.N.S.S.

Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail is hereby **allowed**.
