	Anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioner namely Ankit Kumar @ Sumit Kumar Yadav, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Gopalpur P.S. Case No. 297/24, registered U/s 191(2), 190, 75(2), 115(2), 118(1), 109(1) & 352 BNS. The informant has registered a case against the petitioner Gopeshwar Yadav that he tried to molest her daughter and on other co-accused that they have assaulted with lathi, danda, rod, pharsa and knife. Hence, the present F.I.R. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner argued that the petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. Learned counsel further argued that the prosecution story is totally false, fabricated and concocted. Learned counsel further argued that except the present case, no other case is pending against this petitioner and the petitioner bears clean past. With these arguments learned counsel for the petitioners prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Per contra, learned P.P. for the State argued that the offence alleged to has been committed by the petitioner is serious in nature, as such the petitioner is not entitled to grant anticipatory bail. Heard the Ld. Counsels for the parties and perused the case record. There are total 8 named accused in this case. This petitioner and other co-accused have assaulted to the informant who sustained simple injuries caused by hard and blunt substance as per medical report. There is only omnibus allegation, there is no specific allegation against the petitioner. There is no repeated blow by this petitioner to the informant/victim. Co-accused Aditya Yadav & Om Prakash Yadav has been	

Contd. <u>10-04-2026</u>	granted bail vide B.P. No. 330/25 dated 23.04.2025 & B.P. No. 127/25 dated 25.02.2025 respectively. As per bail petition, the petitioner has clean past. So, on the basis of above grounds, the bail of the petitioner is liable to be granted. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, anticipatory bail of the petitioner is hereby allowed. Let the petitioner in the event of arrest or surrender within four weeks of the instant order before the Court below be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the Court below with conditions that (i) the petitioner shall cooperate in the Trial Court proceedings (ii) In case of repetition of any type of offence with which he have been charged with in future his bail bond shall be automatically cancelled.
