1. This bail application filed on behalf of above named accused-petitioner, who is in judicial custody since 08-04-2026, in connection with Shripur P.S. Case No. 326 of 2025, registered U/S 316(2) and 318(4) of the B.N.S., is put up for hearing today.

2. As per the FIR, prosecution case in brief is that on the basis of written application of the informant, Shripur P.S. Case No. 326 of 2025 has been lodged against accused Raju Singh U/S 316(2) and 318(4) of the B.N.S. for the alleged offence of dated 28-12-2025. It is inter alia alleged in the F.I.R. that on the alleged date and time of occurrence, petitioner Raju Singh has taken Rs. 80,000/- from the informant in the name of getting him a job in the abroad. It is alleged that on faith, informant gave Rs. 80,000/- to petitioner and having taken the money, petitioner sent a forge Visa and Air ticket to the informant. It is alleged that when Visa and Air ticket was verified by the informant through online, it was found that Visa and Air ticket are forged one. When, informant tried to meet with petitioner, he refused to meet with the informant and threatened him. When informant went to the house of petitioner, where assault was committed with him. It is alleged that the office of the said accused person situated at Vishvakarma Chowk Dhanaha West Champaran, Bettiah was found to be closed and the mobile numbers of the said accused bearing mobile no. 7050281583 and 7070284735 were also found to be switched off by which conversation took place.

3. It is submitted on behalf of the accused-petitioner that he is innocent and has committed no offence and has been falsely implicated in this case. It is further submitted that petitioner has got seven criminal antecedent. It is further submitted that as a matter of fact, petitioner runs C.S.P. and many persons used to ask for money on the account of the petitioner and after receiving the same, the amount is given to those persons. It is alleged that offence alleged are punishable below seven years

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and therefore, he is entitled to be released on bail because without any compliance of Sec. 41(c) Cr.P.C. no one can be remanded to jail custody. It is lastly submitted that petitioner is in custody since 08-04-2026. On such strength, prayer for bail has been made by the petitioner.

4. Heard ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner as well as ld. P.P. for the State. Ld. P.P. has opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

5. Having heard both the parties and perused the case record along with case diary. From the perusal of the F.I.R as well as case diary, it transpires that petitioner is named in the F.I.R. against whom there is allegation that he has allegedly taken Rs. 80,000/- from the informant in the name of getting him a job in abroad and gave forge Visa and Air Ticket to the informant. Informant and witnesses at para-05, 06 and 07 of the case diary have fully supported the case of the prosecution. Para-15 of the case diary shows that petitioner has got criminal antecedent of seven criminal cases. Para-39 of the case diary shows that during the course of investigation, petitioner was caught by the police. In para-40 of the case diary, petitioner has confessed his guilt. From perusal of para-42, 43, 44, 45, 46 and 48 of the case diary, it appears that the accused petitioner has taken money from the several persons on the pretext of sending them in abroad and he has taken money even from them on the basis of wrong Visa. Some photocopies of the Visa passport and transaction statement are available on record which supports the prosecution case. Para-59 of the case diary shows that investigation is still going on. From perusal of the record, it appears that some photo copies of Air ticket, Visa and transaction details were filed. From perusal of the material available on record, it appears that accused-petitioner has committed fraud and Cyber crime with many persons and complicity of this petitioner in the alleged crime appears to be true. Investigation is still going on.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case and considering the seriousness of the offence, this court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner. Hence, bail prayer of the petitioner is hereby **rejected**.
