ORDER

11-06-2026

1. This Bail Application filed on behalf of above named accused-petitioners, who are in judicial custody since 26-04-2026, in connection with Vijaipur P.S. Case No. 126 of 2026, registered U/S 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 109, 352 and 351(2)/3(5) of the B.N.S., is put up for hearing today.

2. As per the FIR, prosecution case in brief is that on the basis of written application of the informant, Vijaipur P.S. Case No. 126 of 2026 has been lodged against the petitioner and others. It is inter alia alleged in the F.I.R. that petitioner Robin Bhagat, who is the neighbour used to throw garbage at the door of the informant. On dated 24-04-2026 at about 10:30 O'clock, petitioner was throwing garbage at the door of the informant. When informant forbade, petitioner along with other accused persons armed with lathi-danda and iron-rod came and while abusing, they caught the hair of the informant and slammed him down and assaulted him with fists and slaps. Meanwhile, petitioner Robin Bhagat started assaulting the informant with rod and she sustained bleeding injury in her head. When informant raised alarm, informant's husband Upendra Singh rushed there, who was assaulted by the accused persons with lathi-danda and iron-rod and he sustained injury and fell down. It is alleged that accused Niraj Kumar armed with iron-rod inflicted blow on the head of the informant's husband and he sustained bleeding injury in his head.

3. It is submitted on behalf of accused/petitioners that they are innocent and have committed no offence and have been falsely implicated in this case. It is further submitted that petitioners have got no criminal antecedent. It is further submitted that as a matter of fact, marriage of the

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petitioner's daughter was held in the month of June 2026, informant and her husband intentionally want to disturb the marriage ceremony for quarrel. It is further submitted that except Section 109 B.N.S., remaining Sections are bailable in nature. It is lastly submitted that petitioners are in custody since 26-04-2026. On such strength, prayer for bail has been made by the petitioners.

4. Heard ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners as well as ld. P.P. for the State. Ld. P.P. for the State has opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioners.

5. Having heard both the parties and perused the case record along with case diary. From the perusal of the F.I.R as well as case diary, it transpires that petitioners are named in the F.I.R. and there is allegation against petitioner Robin Bhagat that he has allegedly assaulted the informant with iron-rod and she sustained bleeding injury in her head and there is allegation against petitioner Niraj Kumar that he has allegedly inflicted iron-rod blow on the head of the informant's husband and he sustained bleeding injury in his head. It further appears that both the parties are next door neighbour and due to dispute of throwing garbage, occurrence took place between the parties. Although, informant and witnesses at para-02, 06 and 07 of the case diary have supported the case of the prosecution but witnesses have stated that owing to dispute of throwing garbage, assaulted took place between the parties. Para-10 of the case diary shows that petitioners were caught by the police. From perusal of the injury reports of injured persons at para-20 and 21 of the case diary, it appears that injuries are found to be simple caused by hard and blunt substance. Para-23 of the case diary shows that petitioners have got no criminal antecedent. Independent witness at para-28 of the case diary has stated that owing to the dispute of throwing garbage, assault took place between the parties. The petitioners appear to be in custody since 26-04-2026.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case and considering the period of custody of the petitioners and without going into the merit of the case, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners and hence, the same is hereby allowed. Petitioners are directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the ld. Court below

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subject to conditions that one of the bailors shall be close relative of the petitioners and one shall be local and they shall file an undertaking that they shall not threat or contact to the informant, they shall cooperate in the investigation or trial and they shall not temper with the evidence.

Let a copy of this order along with lower court record be sent to the ld. Lower court for information and needful.
