	Anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioners 1.) Bhallu Bin, 2.) Pappu Kumar Bin, 3.) Harendra Bin and 4.) Lawangi Devi who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Gopalganj P.S. Case no. 717/2025 U/s. 79, 75, 74, 352, 351(2) 3(5) of BNS. The prosecution story in brief on the written application of the informant namely Basmati Devi is that on 15.09.2025 around 5 pm evening, Pappu Kumar Bin was speaking obscenities to the informant's daughter which the informant's daughter was opposing and narrated the whole incident to the informant. Thereafter, when the informant and her husband complained about this incident to the father and mother of Pappu Kumar Bin, they altogether started verbally abusing the informant and her husband. It is alleged that they threatened the informant that they will forcibly take away her daughter and they will get her married to Pappu Kumar Bin. It is further alleged that on 18.09.2025, Pappu Kumar Bin was trying to have sexual relations with the informant's daughter by holding her arm, when the informant arrived, he ran away. Hence, the present FIR. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners argued that the petitioners are innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. Learned counsel further argued that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent. With these arguments learned counsel for the petitioner prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Ld. P.P. for the State opposed the bail prayer of the petitioners. Having heard the Id. Counsel for the parties and perused the case diary. It is apparent from the LCR that the statement of the victim under	

<u>contd.</u> <u>22-05-2026</u>	Sections 180 and 183 of the BNSS has not yet been recorded. It is further noted that the informant is present in court and has submitted a compromise petition. At this stage, no grievance has been expressed by any party, and the matter appears to be amicably resolved between the parties. The learned court below is directed to proceed with the consideration of the confirmation of the provisional bail only after carefully perusing and taking into account the victim's statement. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, let the petitioners be enlarged on provisional bail up to <u>30.06.2026</u> on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the court below subject to conditions that (i) the petitioner shall cooperate in the Trial Court proceedings.
