1. This is a regular bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioner who is in judicial custody since 19.12.2025 in connection with Chandradip P.S. Case No.31/2025 registered for the offence U/s.80 read with 3(5) of B.N.S. pending in the court of A.C.J.M.1st,Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Sitaram Singh,the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned P.P.for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Pinki Devi has lodged this case alleging therein that that she has solemnised marriage of his daughter Tannu Kumari with Prince Kumar Singh on 23.12.2023 as per Hindu rites and rituals. According to the informant at the time of marriage she has given gold ornaments worth Rs.20 lakhs, but soon after the marriage within 6 months, the in-laws of her daughter started to inflict physical and mental torture to her daughter on account of purchasing a land in Ranchi. The in-laws of her daughter were demanding a sum of Rs.5 lakhs, whereupon, the informant has talked to her Samdhi Vidya Bhushan Singh (petitioner) and tried to make him under-stand that she is not in a position to fulfill the demand. However, the informant some how managed a sum of Rs.50,000/-and gave to the co-accused Prince Kumar Singh. It is alleged on 5.3.2025 at about 11 A.M. the informant received an information that Prince Kumar Singh and other accused persons as named in the F.I.R. including the petitioner have killed the daughter of the informant by strangulation. Having received the information when the informant went to the in-laws house of her

daughter, she found her daughter dead. Accordingly an information was given to the police station. Police came and took the dead body for postmortem. Thus, on the basis of aforesaid information, F.I.R. was lodged, and investigation was started.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner has earlier moved his pre arrest bail in the Hon'ble Court, but his prayer was rejected with the observation that "if the petitioner No.3 is able to furnish any evidence about his alibi that he was in Ranchi on the alleged date of occurrence, the same may be considered by the learned District Court". In this regard, it is submitted that the petitioner was in Ranchi on the alleged date of the occurrence which is evident from the certificate issued by the Steel Authority of India Limited, in which, it is certified that the petitioner was employed as a contractual worker on the date of the occurrence and was present there. The petitioner further produced the attendance sheet and other relevant documents regarding his alibi which is annexed with the bail petition. It is further submitted that mother-in-law as well as brother-in-law of the deceased have been given the privilege of anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble Court and the allegation against the petitioner is almost on similar footing, and he is languishing in judicial custody since 19.12.2025 having clean antecedent.

5. The learned P.P. for the State has opposed the prayer for bail but conceded that other co-accused except the husband have been granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble Court, and husband of the deceased is in judicial custody since 25.7.2025.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, and further considering the particular fact that the petitioner has produced the relevant documents which prima-facie shows that he was in Ranchi on the alleged date of the occurrence. Moreover, other similar co-accused persons except husband of the deceased have been granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble Court, and the petitioner is languishing in

judicial custody for more than two months.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below **subject to the conditions that one of the bailors of the petitioner must be his close relative, and petitioner shall remain present before the court below on each and every date, failing to appear on two consecutive dates without any cogent reason shall result in cancellation of his bail bond.**
