This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of petitioners **1. Puspa Devi and 2. Bangali Mandal** who are apprehending arrest in Sono P.S. Case No. 14/2026 registered u/s-126(2), 115(2), 109, 352, 351(2), 74, 303(2), 3(5) of B.N.S, the copy of which is served upon the ld. P.P.

The ld. Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that no other bail petition was filed either in this ld. Court or before Hon'ble High Court, Patna. The petitioners have got no criminal antecedent. The petitioners have not been given notice u/s 35(3) of BNSS by the police. All sections areailable except sections 109, 74 and 303(2) of BNS which are not made out against the petitioners. As per ld. Counsel the petitioners are innocent, have committed no offence and have been falsely implicated in this case due to some mischief mongers of the village. There is no allegation against the petitioners to assault the informant's daughter-in-law Lalita Devi with any weapon on vital part of her body. The real fact is that some quarrel between the children of both the parties occurred in course of playing. The petitioners are persons of means and there is no chance of their absconding and they are ready to furnish bail bond to the satisfaction of ld. Court. In such view the ld. Counsel prayed to admit the petitioners to anticipatory bail.

The ld. Addl. PP opposed the prayer for bail.

On perusal of the case diary it is clear that the petitioners are F.I.R. named accused persons. The prosecution case in brief is that as per the informant Gopal Mandal on 27.01.2026 at about 5 in the evening, his grand son and child of Bangali Mandal had quarreled while playing. The child of Bangali Mandal beat up his grand son. His grand son came to his house. When his daughter-in-law Lalita Devi came to the house of petitioners to raise protest, the accused Bangali Mandal 2. Puspa Devi, 3. Kalpana Kumari, 4. Mannu Kumar, 5. Manika Kumari all caught her by hair and threw on the ground and they assaulted his daughter-in-law. Bangali Mandal assaulted his

daughter-in-law. They all assaulted his daughter-in-law with intention to kill and she became unconscious. Upon the hue and cry nearby people came to save his daughter-in-law and took her to hospital for treatment from where she was referred to Jamui Hopsital. Puspa Devi snatched gold chain and ear-ring of his daughter-in-law. The informant in his re-statement in CD para-2 has stated the same facts. The witnesses in CD paras- 6, 7, 8 and 35 have supported the case of prosecution. The injury report of Lalita Devi as per CD para-39 X-Ray and CT Scan of brain all shows normal study and injuries are simple in nature. The Court finds that there is no specific allegation against the petitioners to have assaulted Lalita Devi with any weapon. The allegation is general and omnibus.

Therefore in view of the facts and circumstances of this case having regard to the submission of both parties, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed**. The petitioners **1. Puspa Devi and 2. Bangali Mandal** in the event of their arrest or surrender are directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the concerned Court.
