1. This is an anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioner apprehending his arrest in connection with Jhajha P.S.Case No.116/2026 registered for the offence U/s.115(2), 126(2), 74, 76, 352 and 351(2) of the B.N.S.pending in the court of the C.J.M., Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Ashok Prasad Keshri, the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned P.P.for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Shobha Devi has lodged the instant case by way of submitting an application before the SHO of Jhajha Police Station alleging therein that on 9.3.2026 at 9 P.M. when she went to attend the marriage ceremony of her agnate along with family members, in the mean time, the petitioner came from behind and outraged her modesty in front of her relative and other persons present there. When the informant made an alarm, then the petitioner fled away.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner has not moved earlier any bail petition either before this court or before the Hon'ble Court. The petitioner has clean antecedent. Both the parties are happens to be relative and due to bonafide mis-under-standing, the present case was registered. But now both parties have entered into an amicable settlement through a written compromise which is part of the record.

5. The learned P.P.for the State has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, and further considering the particular fact that both the parties are happens to be relatives, and there is amicable settlement of their grievance through a written compromise. Moreover, the petitioner has clean antecedent.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioner be released on anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest or surrender before the court below within four weeks from the date of the order on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down U/s.482(2) of the B.N.S.S.
