ORDER

Anticipatory bail application filed on behalf of petitioners Krishna Manjhi @ Krishna Kumar S/o Ramdeo Manjhi and Manakala Devi @ Manakwa Devi W/o Ramdeo Manjhi Both R/o Vill- Ropabel, P.S- Garhi, District- Jamui in connection with **Garhi P.S Case No.- 45/2026**, U/S- 126(2), 115(2), 117(1), 109, 118(2), 352, 351(2) of B.N.S, is put up before me for order today. Copy of bail petition has duly been given to Ld. A.P.P.

The prosecution case in brief as per F.I.R is that Ranjan Kumar had broken the wall of informant's house. When informant saw the broken wall he went to his maternal grandmother Mankawa Devi and complained about him whereupon she reached at the place of occurrence along with his grandson. Following her Krishna Manjhi and Ramdeo Manjhi also reached there. Ramdeo Manjhi instigated Krishna Manjhi to hit the informant, upon which Krishna Manjhi assaulted him with iron rod and Ramdeo Manjhi tossed him on the ground. Ramdeo Manjhi's wife was pelting stones on informant's mother. Informant was taken to P.H.C Khaira and he got 18 stitches. The paper of the said treatment is being attached therein.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that they are quite innocent and have committed no offence and have falsely been implicated in this case with an ulterior motive. He further submitted that no bail application either anticipatory or regular on behalf of the petitioners have been filed or rejected either by the Sessions Court or by the Hon'ble High Court Patna earlier. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. Allegation leveled against the petitioners are totally false frivolous and concocted. There is no allegation of any overt-act against this petitioners. All the offences are bailable except allegation U/s- 109 of B.N.S which is not applicable against these petitioners. Thus, it is submitted that they may be allowed bail.

On the other hand learned A.P.P. opposed the bail application. Ld. counsel for the informant submits that the accused persons assaulted the injured brutally and still they are threatening the informant and others. He submits that he will file the paper of treatment of the injured in the court if he is given an opportunity.

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Heard the submission made by both the parties. Allegation against the petitioners Krishna Manjhi is that he assaulted the informant from iron rod on his head and Mankawa Devi pelted stones upon informant's mother. The F.I.R shows that there are 18 stitches on the head of informant and he has annexed the treatment paper of P.H.C with the F.I.R but the Case-diary does not show any paper of treatment annexed with F.I.R rather the injury report shows lacerated wound on left and right side of the skull of informant which have been shown as simple in nature. Photo of the injured has been shown in Para-3 of the Case-diary which shows bleeding coming out of the injury of the injured. There is direct and specific allegation against the petitioner Krishna Manjhi and the matter is under investigation. So, I am not inclined to allow bail to him. Accordingly prayer for bail made by petitioner Krishna Manjhi is **Rejected** hereby.

As far as prayer for bail made by petitioner Manakala Devi and @ Manakwa Devi is considered . She is not the author of this injury caused to injured Ranjan Kumar. She is lady. Allegation against her is that she pelted stones on informant's mother. There is no injury report of the informant's mother attached in the case-diary. There is no other allegation against this petitioner. So, I am of the view to **allow** bail to other petitioner Manakala Devi and @ Manakwa Devi. Accordingly in case of arrest or surrender within one month of receiving the order the petitioner is directed to be released on furnishing a bail bond of Rs. 20,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of Ld. Trial court with condition that one of the bailor will be close relative/family member of the petitioner with further condition that the petitioner will co-operate in investigation and trial and she will remain present when ordered so.
