1. This is an anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioners apprehending their arrest in connection with Khaira P.S.Case No.86/2026 registered for the offence U/s.126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109(1), 329(4), 351(2), and 352 read with 3(5) of the B.N.S.and section 34 of Prevention of Witch Practices Act pending in the court of the C.J.M., Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Ashok Kumar Sinha, the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned P.P. for the State assisted by Sri Shyamdeo Singh, the learned counsel for the informant.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Sangita Devi has lodged the instant case by way of submitting an application before the SHO of Khaira Police Station alleging therein that on 3.3.2026 the F.I.R. named total eight accused persons including the petitioners came at the house of the informant having lashed with stick, lathi, and iron rod and started abusing the informant and further referred the informant as Daain. It is further alleged that the accused Niranjana Kumar pull down the hair of the informant and also struck on her head by iron rod, consequently she got injury and fell down on the earth. Thereafter, the informant started crying, then her husband and daughter came in her rescue, then they were also assaulted by the accused persons.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are innocent and falsely implicated in this case. There is no specific allegation of any overt act alleged against the petitioners. The nature of injury caused to the informant and her husband are simple. It is further submitted that earlier no any regular or anticipatory bail petition has been filed either before this court or before the Hon'ble Court.

5. The learned P.P.for the State assisted by the learned counsel for the informant have opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, and further considering the particular fact that there is no specific allegation of any overt act alleged against the petitioners, and nature of injury caused to the informant and her husband are simple.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioners be released on anticipatory bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the court below within four weeks from the date of the order on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down U/s.482(2) of the B.N.S.S.
