1. This is an anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioners apprehending their arrest in connection with Sono (Charkapathar) P.S. Case No.323/2025 registered for the offence U/s. 126(2), 115(2), 352, 351(2), 74, 329(4), 110, 117(2) and 303(2) read with 3(5) of the B.N.S. pending in the court of the A.C.J.M.2nd, Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Sunil Kumar Singh, the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned P.P. for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Laxman Yadav has lodged the instant case by way of submitting an application before the SHO of Sono Police Station alleging therein that on 14.12.2025 there was a theft in the house of the informant, and when the informant was sitting in his new house along with his family members, then at the same time, F.I.R. named total nine accused persons including the petitioners came there and started scuffling with the informant and his family members, and it is further alleged that Jogan Yadav (petitioner) struck on the head of the Sangita Devi by means of lathi who happens to be daughter-in-law of the informant and wife of the informant was assaulted by Khagan Yadav (petitioner) and when son of the informant namely Pintu Yadav came, then the co-accused Diplal Yadav assaulted him on his hand and consequently, his hand was got fractured, and thereafter accused Bhaglu Yadav (petitioner) assaulted to the informant by means of lathi. It is further alleged that the accused persons also looted the valuables and ornaments from the house of the informant.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are innocent and falsely implicated in this case. It is also submitted that there is only one grievous injury to Pintu Kumar on his hand which is not the vital part of the body, and the same is attributed by co-accused Diplal Yadav who has been granted anticipatory bail by this court vide an order dated 18.6.2026 passed in ABA.506/2026, and his other injuries are simple in nature. Apart from Pintu Kumar, no any other person has received any injury. Both the parties are happens to be co-villagers and agnet to each other and there is civil dispute between them, and all the petitioners have clean antecedent.

5. The learned P.P.for the State has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail but conceded that earlier the other co-accused has already been granted anticipatory bail as stated aforesaid.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, and further considering the particular fact that all the injuries are simple in nature except one injury to Pintu Kumar which is said to be grievous, but the same is neither on vital part of the body, nor attributed to the petitioners. The petitioners have clean antecedent. Moreover, other co-accused Dipal Yadav has already been granted anticipatory bail by this court as stated aforesaid.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioners be released on anticipatory bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the court below within four weeks from the date of the order on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down U/s.482(2) of the B.N.S.S.
