1. This is a regular bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioner who is in judicial custody since 07.4.2026 in connection with Laxmipur P.S.Case No.344/2024 registered for the offence U/s.191(2), 126(2), 115(2), 109(1), 351(2), 352 and 117(1) of B.N.S. pending in the court of Ms.Manisha Kumari, J.M. 1st class,Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Murlidhar Pandey,the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned P.P.for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Gorelal Yadav has lodged the instant case by way of submitting an application before the SHO of Laxmipur Police Station alleging therein that on 11.10.2024 at about 5 P.M., when the informant was at his house, his brother Sildhar Yadav has called him on phone and told that the accused persons as named in the F.I.R. are abusing and assaulting him. Having heard this, the informant went to his Bathan in order to save his brother. However, as soon as the informant came out of the house, accused persons namely Inderdeo Yadav (petitioner) and Babloo Yadav caught hold of the informant and started to assault him with Farsa, lathi iron rod etc. The informant in order to save his life ran away towards his house. However, the accused person have chased him to his house and it is specifically been alleged that co-accused Babloo Yadav with the help of Farsa has assaulted on his head. Further petitioner Inderdeo Yadav has also assaulted the informant with iron rod, and due to which, the informant has sustained injury on his head and hand. Having sustained the injury, the informant fell down on the ground, whereupon, other family members namely Sabita Devi, Samtula Devi,and Rita Devi have also abused and assaulted the informant. On the basis of aforesaid information, F.I.R.was lodged,and investigation was started.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and falsely implicated in this case. Similarly situated other

co-accused Bablu Yadav has been granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble Court vide an order dated 7.4.2026 passed in Cr.Misc.No.87430/2025. The allegation against the petitioner is that he has assaulted to the informant by iron rod, but as per allegation, the petitioner has not assaulted on the vital part of the informant, though, the injury is grievous in nature.

5. The learned P.P.for the State has opposed the prayer for bail and submitted that the petitioner has three criminal antecedent.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and further considering the particular fact that similarly situated other co-accused has been granted anticipatory bail by the Hon'ble Court as stated aforesaid, and the petitioner is languishing in judicial custody for more than one month.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
