1. **One anticipatory bail application No.555/2026** has been filed on behalf of the **petitioners namely 1) Vijay Kumar Ram @ Vijay Ram, and 2) Bipin Kumar @ Bipin Ram,** and another **anticipatory bail application No.714/2026** has been filed on behalf of the **petitioners namely 1) Dinesh Ram, 2) Janmayjay Kumar, 3) Ajay Ram, and 4) Rahul Kumar.** These two applications arise out of the same case i.e. **Lachhuar P.S. Case No.52/2026 registered U/s.190, 191(2), 115(2), 126(2), 117(2), 109(1), and 303(2) of the B.N.S.** pending in the court of Ms. Medha Manisha, J.M. 1st class, Jamui. Hence, both are taken up together for hearing and disposal by a common order.
2. Heard Sri Makeshwar Prasad Yadav, the learned counsel for

the petitioners and the learned P.P.for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Sandhya Devi has lodged the instant case by way of submitting an application before the SHO of Lachhuar P.S. alleging therein that on 11.4.2026 in the evening when the informant and her husband were returning from Sikandra market after purchasing some articles, then as soon as they reached at their house, then total eight F.I.R. named accused persons including the petitioners having lashed with iron rod, spear, and Farsa attacked on the husband of the informant and it is further alleged that Bijay Ram struck on the head of the husband of the informant and other accused persons have also brutally assaulted him, consequently, the husband of the informant got injury on his head. It is further alleged that when the informant and her sister-in-law, namely Suruchi Kumari came for rescue, then accused Rahul Ram assaulted on the head of Suruchi Kumari and the informant, and they also snatched ornaments from the informant.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are innocent and falsely implicated in this case. The petitioners have clean antecedent. There is case and counter case between the parties, and the occurrence happened due to previous enmity. It is lastly submitted that both the parties have amicably settled their dispute by way of written compromise and the informant and her husband appeared before this court and do not oppose the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.

5. The learned P.P.for the State has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail but conceded the factum of compromise between the parties.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, and further considering the particular fact that nature of injury is simple and both the parties have amicably settled their dispute by way of written compromise, and the informant and her husband appeared before

this court and do not oppose the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioners be released on anticipatory bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the court below within four weeks from the date of the order on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down U/s.482(2) of the B.N.S.S.
