1. This is a regular bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioner who is in judicial custody since 25.4.2026 in connection with Jhajha P.S. Case No.188/2026 registered for the offence U/s.126(2), 115(2), 109(1), 352 and 351(2) read with 3(5) of B.N.S. pending in the court of the C.J.M.,Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Sunil Kumar Yadav,the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned P.P.for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Rohit Kumar has lodged the instant case by way of submitting an application before the SHO of Jhajha Police Station alleging therein that on 23.4.2026 the F.I.R. named total five accused persons including the petitioner abused and assaulted the informant by means of rod and stick and it is specifically alleged against Jyotish Yadav that he struck on the head of the informant by iron rod.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and falsely implicated in this case. There is general and omnibus allegation against the petitioner. Moreover, both the parties have entered into amicable settlement and they have settled their dispute amicably,and in support of compromise, a written compromise petition has also been filed which is on record. The informant is present in the court and he does not oppose the prayer for bail of the petitioner. The petitioner has clean antecedent.

5. The learned P.P.for the State has opposed the prayer for bail but conceded the factum of compromise.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and further considering the particular fact that there is general and omnibus

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allegation against the petitioner and both the parties have entered into an amicable settlement, and informant appeared before this court and does not oppose the prayer for bail of the petitioner and supported the factum of compromise between the parties.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
