

**IN THE COURT OF AMIT KUMAR, ADDL. SESSIONS JUDGE V, JAMUI**

1. The present anticipatory bail application has been filed on behalf of the accused petitioners namely **1. Bodhan Yadav**, S/o Tota Yadav, aged about 74 years, **2. Lakhiya Devi**, W/o Bodhand Yadav, aged about 62 years, **3. Ranjit Yadav**, S/o Bodhan Yadav, aged about 45 years and **4. Muniya Devi @ Muniya Kumari**, W/o Ranjit Yadav, aged about 22 years, all are R/o Vill- Pipratand Baribag, PS.- Khaira, District- Jamui, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Jamui Mahila P.S. Case No. 14/2024 registered under sections 341, 323, 379, 498-A, 494, 504, 506 and 34 of the I.P.C.

2. As per FIR, informant Devki Devi alleges that her marriage was solemnized with Mukesh Yadav about ten years ago. At the time of marriage her father had given rupees five lakhs in cash and articles of rupees two lakhs in the form of gift. After marriage when she went at her matrimonial house, she lived there happily for some time. On 2020, she was blessed with a baby girl. Thereafter, all the accused persons named in the FIR including these petitioners started demanding a motorcycle in dowry and on non-fulfillment of the same they were started torturing the informant and ousted her with her daughter from her matrimonial house. On dated 02.03.2024, she came to know that her husband has solemnized another marriage with one Rupa Devi on dated 29.01.2024, thereafter she returned to her matrimonial house on the same day and objected the said marriage upon which all the FIR named accused persons brutally beaten her and again ousted her from her matrimonial house and threatens to kill her if she returns again. On the basis of above, FIR was registered against the accused persons.

3. Ld counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence and falsely been implicated in this case. No other bail application on behalf of the petitioners are pending in this court or any other court except the present one. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. The petitioner no.1 and 2 are father-in-law and mother-in-law and petitioner no. 3 is Bhainsur and petitioner no. 4 is her Bharishur's wife and these petitioners have no involvement in the alleged case. Therefore, it has been prayed that the accused petitioners may kindly be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

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4. On the other hand, learned Addl. P.P. for the state has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.
5. Heard both the parties in detail and perused the record.
6. The FIR has been registered for the offence punishable under sections 341, 323, 379, 498-A, 494, 504, 506 and 34 of the I.P.C. Re-statement of informant has been recorded vide para no.2 and statement of witnesses has been recorded vide para no. 3, 8, 9, 10, 21, 22, 44, 45 and 46 of the case diary.
7. On perusal of the record, it transpires that though there is allegation against present petitioners of committing torture and harassment to the informant on non-fulfillment of dowry demand, however, there is no specific allegation of assault and torture have been made against them. The doctor has opined injury of informant Devki Devi as simple in nature. Form perusal of record it further transpires that the petitioners have been extended liberty of u/s 41(A) Cr.P.C. Charge-sheet against the petitioners has already been submitted.
7. Considering aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, nature of allegation against petitioners, the anticipatory bail application of the petitioners namely **Bodhan Yadav, Lakhiya Devi, Ranjit Yadav, Muniya Devi @ Muniya Kumari, is hereby allowed.** Accordingly, it is ordered that at the event of arrest or surrender of the above-named petitioners before the court below within a period of four weeks from the date of this order shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned court below with the conditions as laid down 438(2) of the Cr.P.C. Further, with the condition that one of the bailors should be close-relative or family member of the petitioner.
9. O/C is directed to send back lower court record along with a copy of this order to the concerned court for needful.
