1. This is a regular bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioner who is in judicial custody since 20.1.2026 in connection with Jhajha P.S.Case No.416/2025 registered for the offence U/s.140(2), 3(5), and 61(2) of B.N.S. pending in the court of the C.J.M.,Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Sitaram Singh,the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned P.P.for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the instant case has been lodged by the informant Ramashish Ganguly @ Santosh on the basis of his fard beyan recorded by the SHO of Jhajha P.S. at Teliyadih alleging therein that on 25.8.2025 at 8 p.m. when the informant's younger brother Devashish Ganguly @ Bablu has gone to fetch milk from the house of Sahdev Yadav and when he did not return, the informant called to one of the neighbourers of Sahdev Yadav, namely Pintu Rajak who informed that his younger brother has proceeded fifteen minutes ago. After that the informant started searching his brother. One Sonu Yadav disclosed that his younger brother has been abducted by some unknown miscreants on a CNG Toto. Petitioner was found wondering near the place of the occurrence.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner is languishing in judicial custody for near about four months. It is further submitted that the offence is not committed because abducted brother of the informant is said to be released on the same night. It is also submitted that co-accused Manish Kumar has been granted regular bail by the Hon'ble Court vide an order dated 21.1.2026 passed in Cr. Misc. No.80270/2025 and the case of the petitioner is more or less stands on similar footing.

5. The learned P.P.for the State has opposed the prayer for bail.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and further considering the particular fact that the petitioner is named in the F.I.R, and he has several criminal antecedents as it is stated in para 3 of the bail petitioner that he has four criminal antecedents in a serious offences. Moreover, the victim Devashish Ganguly has also taken the name of the petitioner as one of the culprit in this case in his statement recorded U/s.180 of the B.N.S.S. Though other co-accused persons have been granted bail but they are not named in the F.I.R.Hence, the case of this petitioner does not stand on similar footing.

Hence, in view of the serious allegation, this court is not inclined to release the petitioner on bail, and accordingly, his prayer for bail is **rejected**.
