1. This is a regular bail petition filed on behalf of above named petitioner who is in judicial custody since 06.5.2026 in connection with Khaira P.S.Case No.161/2024 registered for the offence U/s.395 of the I.P.C. pending in the court of the C.J.M.,Jamui.

2. Heard Sri Raj Kumar Praveen,the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned P.P.for the State.

3. The prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Laljeet Kumar has lodged the instant case by way of submitting an application before the SHO of Khaira Police Station alleging therein that on 3.5.2024 when the informant after getting down from Tata-Chhapra Express at Gidhor station was returning to his house alongwith his brother on a motorcycle. It is alleged that when both brothers reached near Nijuara bridge at about 10.45 P.M. in the night, suddenly six persons on two motorcycles have stopped the informant and his brother. The accused persons further snatched away the keys of the motorcycle and when brother of the informant tried to protest the accused persons, they took out a pistol and put the brother of the informant on gun point. They further snatched two mobile phones, purse in which, a sum of Rs.5000/- alongwith Aadhar card, Pan Card, Pen driver etc. were kept and later on, after committing the loot the accused persons alongwith the motorcycle of the informant have fled away. On the basis of the aforesaid information, F.I.R. was lodged,and investigation was started.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner is not named in the F.I.R.and his name surfaced in this case on the basis of confessional statement of co-accused Bipin Kumar Das who has been granted bail vide order dated 18.2.2025 passed in B.A.No.98/2025. It is further submitted that there is no any recovery of incriminating articles from the

possession of the petitioner which is apparent from paragraph 66 of the supplementary case diary. Moreover, the confessional statement before the police has no any evidenciary value in the eye of law.

5. The learned P.P.for the State has opposed the prayer for bail and submitted the petitioner has one criminal antecedent.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and further considering the particular fact that similarly situated other co-accused has been granted bail by this court as stated aforesaid,and there is no any recovery from the possession of the petitioner. Moreover, his name surfaced in this case on the basis of confessional statement before the police which has no any evidenciary value in the eye of law.

Hence, in view of the aforesaid facts, let the petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
