1. The present Bail Petition has been filed on behalf of accused-petitioner namely, **Nitish Das**, who is in judicial custody since 09.05.2026 in connection with Jhajha P.S. Case No. 450/2025, U/s 115(2), 126(2), 118(2), 117(2), 109, 3(5) of B.N.S. Act, is hereby disposed of.
2. The case of prosecution in brief is that on dated 15.09.2025 at around 5:30 p.m., the informant was in his home when his sister and wife came and said that the accused were taunting after seeing them, thereafter, the informant went to the house of Nitish Das and asked for such taunting upon which Nitish Das and Kuldeep Das started abusing and when protested then these accused attacked upon the informant by sword and tangi in which to defend his head and neck, the informant sustained injury on his hands.
3. It is submitted by the Ld. Counsel for the accused-petitioner has filed anticipatory bail application bearing no. 427/2026 but during the course of hearing, the petitioner was arrested and thereupon the pre-arrest bail petition of the petitioner was withdrawn.
4. It is also submitted by the Ld. Counsel of the petitioner that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this false case as the parties are having previous land dispute. Further submitted that the petitioner is in custody since 09.05.2026.
5. On the other hand, Ld. A.P.P. opposed the bail and submitted to reject the same.
6. Heard both the sides and perused the material available on record. On perusal of record, it reflects that there is allegation of assault upon the petitioner along with Kuldeep Das. Para 42 and 66 of the CD are the injury report of the victim informant namely Binod Das, wherein it is found by the doctor that the victim sustained three injuries and all of them are lacerated

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wound and all injuries are simple in nature and caused by hard and blunt substance while there is allegation of using sword by the petitioner. Further, para 97 of the CD reflects that the petitioner is having clean antecedent. Moreover, the petitioner is in judicial custody since 09.05.2026.

7. Under the aforesaid facts and circumstances and mainly considering the custody period of the petitioner, a lenient approach can be taken with respect to the petitioner's prayer of Regular Bail. Accordingly, the Regular Bail Petition of the following, the accused-petitioner, namely, **Nitish Das**, is hereby **Allowed**. He is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/-with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned court below with the condition that, one of the bailor must be family member/close relative.

8. The observation made in the present bail petition order are for purpose of deciding the present petition and do not affect the factual matrix of investigation / trial of the present case, which is separate issue as per law.
