An anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of accused-petitioner Ankit Kumar, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Kako P.S Case No. 470/2025 lodged u/s 190, 191(2), 191(3), 324(4), 352, 351(2), 3(5) BNS, 2023 and 27 Arms Act has been pressed today for hearing.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and learned A.P.P for the state.

The prosecution case as per written application of the informant Nagina Devi on dt. 11.12.2025 at about 11:00 am, when the informant was sitting on the door of his house, then all of sudden the accused persons Rohit Yadav, Shailesh Yadav, Brijlala Yadav, Sumanti Devi and 10-12 unknown accused persons having armed with lathi, iron rod, bhala and garasa and accused Ankit Kumar having armed with pistol came and asked about his son and threatened to kill the informant's son by stating said that your son gave an application for encroachment against. Then, informant got scared and went into the house and closed the door and windows, then all of them hurled abuse as well as pelted stone towards the home of the informant and also tried to break the door too. When the people from locality called then accused Ankit Kumar fired at around 6 times. Accordingly, the FIR has been registered.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence at all. It is further submitted that earlier no any anticipatory or regular bail petition has been filed either before this court or Hon'ble High Court, Patna nor the same is pending anywhere. Further nothing incriminating article has been recovered from the possession of the petitioner. Hence, it is prayed to release him on bail.

On the other hand Ld.A.P.P. opposed the prayer for

anticipatory bail by submitting therein that there is a serious allegation of firing six bullets against the accused-petitioners has a criminal antecedent as well.

Heard both the parties and perused the case record. Perusal of the case record shows that there is direct allegations against the present petitioner of firing altogether six bullets towards the house of the informant. However, the petitioner has a criminal antecedent as well. Considering the facts and circumstances of this case, I am not inclined to grant anticipatory bail of the accused-petitioner Ankit Kumar, Hence, the anticipatory bail of the accused-petitioner Ankit Kumar is hereby **rejected**.
