An application for anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of accused petitioners namely 1. Rajendra Prasad, 2.Subodh Kumar Singh and 3. Ashok Yadav, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Kako (Bhelawar OP) PS Case No.207/2025 lodged under Sections 319(2), 318(4), 3(5) B.N.S. has been pressed today for hearing.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners as well as the learned P.P. representing the State.

Prosecution case as per written report of the informant Dharmendra Yadav, in brief, is that he and Ravindra Yadav are son of Chandrika Yadav. Ravindra Yadav married with Rekha Devi whereas Ravindra Yadav was married with Renu Devi. Informant has stated that his grandfather namely Mahavir Yadav and Ram Jaran Yadav and Janak Devi D/o Ram Sharan Yadav have gifted 2 bigha lands from his share in the name of Rekha Devi and Renu Devi. In the year 2009 his wife Rekha Devi went to her mother's house and did not returned and she perform marriage with another persons Ashok Yadav. It is further stated that Rekha Devi sold her gifted properties in the name Girijesh Kumar and Kunal Kumar. On 14.6.2025 when he went to the house of Rekha Devi and asked as to why she has sold his land, Ashok Yadav and others abused him and assaulted him with fists and slaps Rekha Devi brought lathi from house and assaulted him and took out 1200/- from his pocket. It is paternal properties and Partition suit no. 113/2021 is going on.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of accused petitioner submitted that accused petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence as alleged in the FIR. Petitioners carry no criminal antecedent in their credit. There is land dispute between the parties and partition suit is also pending in the court. Petitioner no. 1 is a witness, petitioner no. 2 is writer of the said sale deed and the petitioner no. 3 is identifier and husband of co-accused Rekha Devi. In this case other co-accused persons have already granted anticipatory bail from this court vide order dated 27.02.26 passed in A.B.P. No. 1927/25. The allegation against the petitioners stand on better footing. Petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case without any

reason under the pressure tactics. Petitioners undertakes to abide all the conditions laid down under section 482 (2) B.N.S. Accordingly, prayer has been made to enlarge the petitioners on anticipatory bail .

On the other had, learned P.P. opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail.

Heard and perused the case record. From the perusal of record it appears that grandfather of the informant has gifted two bigha land in favour of wife of informant namely Rekha Devi, who sold that land to the Girijesh Kumar and Kunal Kumar and for this reason alleged occurrence took place between Ashok Yadav (at present husband of Rekha Devi) and informant. It is evident that alleged occurrence took place on 14.6.2025 whereas FIR has been lodged on 26.06.2025 after delay of 12 days without plausible explanation. After giving ample opportunities prosecution has not produce any injury report. It is purely case of civil nature and partition suit is pending in the court It is evident that co-accused persons have already granted anticipatory bail by this court.

Considering the entire facts and circumstances of the case as well as clean antecedent of the petitioners, I am inclined to release the present petitioners on Anticipatory bail. Accordingly, the present anticipatory bail petition is allowed and petitioners above named are ordered to be released on bail on their arrest/surrender in the court within fortnight on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the Ld. Court below with further condition that one of the bailors shall be family member/close relative of the petitioners, who will file an undertaking as to how they are related with the petitioners with another condition that petitioners has to file an undertaking that they never indulged in similar offence in near future and cooperate during the investigation.
