03-06-2026 1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner namely, Sanjar Alam, Petitioner is in custody since 04.02.2026 in connection with Bahadurganj P. S. Case No. 64/2026, registered u/s 103(1), 61(2) of BNS. Also heard learned P. P. for the State.

2. Prosecution story in brief is that on 02.02.2026 at about 06:00 PM her husband left home on his Hero Splendor Plus Motorcycle while talking on the mobile phone and was going towards Bahadurganj. On 03.02.2026 at about 10:30 AM she received information from villagers that her husband was lying dead on the road near Tangtangi Sareh about 700 meters east of Chhalkapul. She immediately reached the spot with her family and found her husband dead and his motorcycle lying on the road. She suspects that some unknown person may have caused her husband's death.

3. Apart from pleading innocence and false implication learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and he has not committed any offence. The petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. The entire allegations alleged in the FIR are totally false, fabricated and concocted. The petitioner is victim of conspiracy hatched by the interested person to destroyed the family of the petitioner. The petitioner is not named in the FIR. Nothing incriminating has been recovered from the petitioner. During investigation petitioner has been made accused in this case on the basis of confessional statement of co-accused petitioner. The police has no connected any offence against the petitioner to connect the petitioner with this crime. Conspiracy has kill to

birds with one stone enmity the petitioner's brother and second petitioner in to judicial custody. The petitioner is in custody since 04.02.2026.

4. Learned P. P. has opposed the prayer for bail.

5. From perusal of record it transpires that the petitioner is not named in the FIR. His name has been cropped up during investigation in the confessional statement of co-accused Manauwar Alam who has stated in his confessional statement that the petitioner said to him that if he kills his brother then he will pay Rs. 3,00,000/-. The petitioner gave him Rs. 1,50,000/- and in the greed of money he committed murder of Manjar Alam with the help of other co-accused persons. The petitioner himself has confessed before the police that he gave Rs. 1,50,000/- to co-accused Manauwar Alam for committing murder of Manjar Alam. Other co-accused persons also confessed in their statement that murder was committed at the instance of this petitioner. From perusal of record it also transpires that after investigation the police has submitted charge-sheet against the petitioner and other co-accused persons and cognizance has been taken against them. Allegation against the petitioner is serious in nature.

6. Therefore, considering the aforesaid facts and nature and gravity of allegations, I am not inclined to grant the privilege of bail to the petitioner. As such, prayer for bail made on behalf of petitioner namely, Sanjar Alam is hereby **rejected**.
