16-06-2026 1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner namely, 1. Rizwan Alam 2. Md. Salauddin, who are in custody since 12.05.2026 in connection with C.C. Case No. 10/2026, registered u/s 9, 39, 49(b), 50, 51(1) of the wildlife (Protection) Act. Also heard learned P. P. for the State.

2. Prosecution story as per written application BOP Commandant, Fatehpur sent to forest officer, Kishanganj is that on 11.05.2026 at about 12:48 two persons coming from the side of Nepal, where they stopped by the SSB personnel. On search antlers was found which was about 01 feet 03 inch long and weight was about 400 gm. On demand they did not show any documents regarding the seized article. Forest officer submitted official complaint before the Ld. C.J.M., Kishanganj. On the basis of report of forest officer C.C. Case No. 10/2026 was registered.

3. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent and they have not committed any offence. The petitioners are laborers by profession, working as carpenters in furniture industries in Nepal for the last several years. They have falsely been implicated in this case. All the allegations made in the complaint petition are totally false, fabricated, concocted and far from truth. The petitioners have no concern with the alleged offence, as nothing has been seized or recovered from their conscious possession. The copy of the seizure list was not provided to the petitioners. There is no independent witness to the alleged seizure list. The seized amount of Indian Rs. 66,500/- and Nepali currency of Rs. 510/- were the petitioners earning money and falsely prepared the seizure list. The petitioners are carpenter/wood worker by profession and have been engaged in furniture industry work for the last 20 -25 years in Nepal, which is duly supported by recommendations verification letters issued by reputed furniture industries of Jhapa, Nepal and certified copy of the verification letter and copies of the payment receipts attached with this bail petition. The

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petitioner is in custody since 12-05-2026. As per para 03 of bail petition, petitioners have clean antecedent.

4. Learned P. P. has opposed the prayer for bail.

5. From perusal of record it transpires that there is allegation against this petitioner that antlers was recovered from the possession of the petitioners and also Indian currency Rs. 66,900/- and Nepali currency Rs. 510/- was recovered and they did not show any document regarding seized article. It has been said by the petitioners that they were coming from the Nepal and where they work as labourers. They have produced several receipts of their works and earnings to show that they will work in furniture shop. The petitioners are in custody since 12.05-2026. Considering the facts and period of custody already undergone by the petitioner, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

6. Accordingly the petitioners namely, 1. Rizwan Alam 2. Md. Salauddin are hereby directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of the amount of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the Learned Court Concerned.
