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1. Heard Smt. Mamta Singh, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioner and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioner has stated in para 2 of his bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying any such occurrence as alleged has ever taken place, it has been submitted on his behalf that the petitioner is not named in FIR and he is quite innocent and has committed no offence as alleged. Learned counsel further submitted that during investigation, police has implicated him as accused and neither the petitioner was present at the place of occurrence nor he has any connection with this occurrence and due to local village politics, petitioner has been implicated in this case. Ld. Counsel further submitted that main accused named in FIR have already been granted anticipatory bail in ABP no. 311 of 2025 vide order dated 25.03.2025 by this Court and the case of this petitioner is on better footing. Petitioner has no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 3 of his petition. Therefore, he prayed that this anticipatory bail petition may be allowed.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Heard the arguments of both the parties and perused the case record. It transpires from the perusal of the case record that petitioner is not named in FIR. The name of this petitioner was first cropped up during investigation as mentioned in para 26 of case diary and allegations against him as per FIR are that on dated 23.01.2025 at around 10:30 O' clock, informant was going to the chamber from his house and saw the 5-6 unknown people along with co-accused were sitting near the chamber and playing cards (gambling). When he tried to stop them for drinking alcohol and playing cards, they started abusing him and beaten him with lathi-danda and injured him and thereafter, co-accused tried to strangle the informant with a towel, somehow, he saved his life and ran away and in that course, they snatched the gold chain from the neck of the informant and took Rs. 10,000/- from his pocket. The injury report of informant is attached with case diary showing private doctor injury no. 3 over shoulder joint fractured is grievous or rest injuries are simple in nature. It is submitted that a minor scuffle was occurred on the date of occurrence between the parties regarding while walking on that road. It is further submitted that a minor scuffle was occurred between the parties on the date of occurrence and informant got injured while falling on ground. It is further submitted that no specific overt act is mentioned against the petitioner either in FIR or case diary available on record. It is further submitted that allegations of snatching valuables appear to be ornamental. Petitioner is stated to have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 3 of his bail petition.
6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of his arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, this petitioner shall be released on bail on his furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
