09.01.23 Heard Sri Kamta Prasad Singh, learned counsel on behalf of the petitioners and Sri Sanjay Singh, learned Spl.P.P. for the State. The informant present in person before the court.

ORDER

A surrender cum bail petition has been filed on behalf of the accused-petitioners namely, **1. Chandan Singh, 2. Ranjeet Singh, 3. Rahul Singh @ Priyaranjan Singh and 4. Vijay Bahadur Singh** in connection with SC/ST Bhabhua P.S. Case No. 13 of 2020 registered for the offence u/s 341, 323, 325, 504, 506/34 of IPC & Section 3(1)(r)(s)/3(2)(va) of SC/ST Act. It is submitted that no regular or anticipatory bail petition on behalf of the petitioners is filed/pending either in this court or any superior court. Apart from two criminal case i.e. Kudra P.S. Case No. 06/2019 & 267/2017 against the petitioner No. 4, there is no other criminal antecedent against any of the petitioners. The assertions have been affirmed by the Ld. Spl.P.P.

The accused-petitioners namely, 1. Chandan Singh, 2. Ranjeet Singh, 3. Rahul Singh @ Priyaranjan Singh and 4. Vijay Bahadur Singh are produced before the court. It is submitted on their behalf that they have not committed any offence and are quite innocent & have falsely been implicated in the case. That no case under SC/ST Act is made out against the petitioners and rest of the offence alleged are bailable in nature. During investigation, the petitioners were granted benefit of Section 41(A) Cr.P.C. and the petitioners never violated the conditions of the bond. After investigation, police submitted the charge-sheet under Section 341, 323, 325, 504, 506/34 of IPC & Section 3(1)(r)(s)/3(2)(va) of SC/ST Act. That a compromise between the informant and the accused petitioners of this case has been arrived at and good sense has prevailed. The informant is present in the court and supports the factum of compromise. Moreover, there is no direct and specific allegation against the petitioners. Hence, the petitioners deserve to be

Heard the counsels and perused the record. Considering the entire material available on the record & compromise petition and the submissions advanced by the counsels in the totality of facts and circumstances of the case, the bail of the petitioners is hereby **allowed**. The petitioners is directed to be released on bail on his furnishing bail bond of Rs. 20,000/- (Twenty Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of this court.
