1. Heard Sri Kamta Prasad Singh and Sri Anil Kumar Singh, learned counsels appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
  2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
  3. Denying any such occurrence as alleged was ever taken place, it is submitted on behalf of the petitioners that they are innocent and have been falsely implicated in this case and the petitioners have got no concern with the impugned rice rather petitioner Sanjay Singh has sold his own rice, moreover, all the sections invoked in this case

are bailable except section 318(4), 316(2) and 308(2) BNS which are no applicable in this case.

4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
5. Heard the arguments of both the parties and perused the case record. It transpires from the perusal of record that petitioners are FIR named and allegations against them as per FIR that on dated 27.01.2026, the informant of this case contacted petitioner Brijesh Pal to transport 425.2 quintal rice to be sent to Shri Shyam Rice Mill at District Unnao (U.P.), through truck bearing registration no. DD01AG9649. Informant further alleged that on dated 28.01.2026 he came to know that the transported rice was not reached to the destination and when he inquired from petitioner Brijesh Pal, he came to know that petitioner Brijesh Pal along with petitioner Sanjay Singh have unloaded the rice sent by him to other place at Parsathua distt. Rohatas. It is submitted on behalf of prosecution that both the accused/petitioners along with co-accused have misappropriated the rice amounting to Rs. 12 lakh 6 thousand. Petitioner Md. Arif is the owner and petitioner Md. Mukhtar is the truck driver of the impugned vehicle through which informant has sent the consignment of rice to Unnao but they along with other FIR named accused have misappropriated and unloaded the rice at some another place in district Rohatas. It is further submitted that informant has neither received the rice sent by him nor the money & investigation against the petitioners are pending.
6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances, I am not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, this anticipatory bail petition is **dismissed**. (Dictated)
