1. Heard Sri Raushan Kumar Yadav, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned PP for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying the allegation in its entirety, it is submitted on behalf of the petitioners that this case is the outcome of matrimonial dispute between the informant and her husband, moreover, these petitioners are parents and unmarried sister's of the husband

of the informant and allegations against them are general, vague and omnibus in nature.

4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.
5. Heard both the parties and perused the record. It transpires from the perusal of record that its a matrimonial dispute. Petitioners are the family members of the husband of informant. Allegations against them as per FIR that they along with the husband of informant have harassed and tortured the informant and finally move her out of matrimonial house. It is submitted on behalf of that they petitioners are in-laws of informant and allegation against them are general and vague. It is further submitted that the informant herself does not want to live with her husband at her matrimonial house. Petitioners are stated to have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 03 of bail their bail petition.
6. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
