05.07.22 Heard Sri Rameshwar Pathak, learned counsel on behalf of the petitioners and Sri Sanjay Singh, learned Spl.P.P. for the State. The informant present in person before the court.

ORDER

A surrender cum bail petition has been filed on behalf of the accused-petitioners namely, **1. Paras Nath Pandey, 2. Vinod Shankar Pandey, 3. Deena Bind and 4. Surendra Bind** in connection with Complaint Case No. 31 of 2018 in which the cognizance has been taken u/s 341, 323, 504/34 of IPC & Section 3(1)(r)(s) of SC/ST Act. It is submitted that the anticipatory bail of the petitioners has already been rejected. No other regular or anticipatory bail petition on behalf of the petitioners is filed/pending either in this court or any superior court and there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioners. Both the assertions have been affirmed by the Ld. Spl.P.P.

The accused-petitioners namely, 1. Paras Nath Pandey, 2. Vinod Shankar Pandey, 3. Deena Bind and 4. Surendra Bind are produced before the court. It is submitted on their behalf that they have not committed any offence and are quite innocent & have falsely been implicated in the case. That no case under SC/ST Act is made out against the petitioners and rest of the offence alleged are bailable in nature. That a compromise between the informant and the accused petitioners of this case has been arrived at and good sense has prevailed. The informant is present in the court and supports the factum of compromise. The informant has also filed an affidavit stating that they shall not claim any compensation in future. Moreover, there is no direct and specific allegation against the petitioners. Hence, the petitioners deserve to be granted bail.

The learned Spl. P.P. gracefully conceded to the submissions of the parties.

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05.07.22 Heard the counsels and perused the record. Considering the entire material available on the record & compromise petition and the submissions advanced by the counsels in the totality of facts and circumstances of the case, the bail of the petitioners is hereby **allowed**. The petitioners are directed to be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 20,000/- (Twenty Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of this court.
