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1. Heard Sri Rajnikant Patel, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that they are innocent, have not committed any such offence and have been falsely implicated in this case on the basis of false and concocted story. It is, therefore, prayed that their bail petition may be allowed.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioners stating that these petitioners are the transporters who provided the impugned truck for transport of wheat to Odisha but the truck did not reach the destination and these petitioners along with other FIR named accused have stolen and misused the loaded wheat amounting to Rs. 8,59,561/-.
 5. Heard the arguments of both the parties and perused the case record. It transpires from the perusal of record that petitioners are FIR named and allegations against them as per FIR are that they are the proprietor of Rohtak Haryana, Rajasthan transport having branch office at Old GT Road Chandasi, Mugalsarai and they have pro-

vided a truck to the informant for transporting wheat to Odisha. The informant further alleged that the a truck bearing registration no. RJ02-GB-5533 was provided by these petitioners and 305.7 quintal wheat were loaded on the truck from the godown of Sushila Arya at Mohania and was to be transported to Maa Mangala Flour Mill Pvt. Ltd. Jalna (Odisha) but the truck did not reach the destination and when informant try to contact the driver of the vehicle, his mobile phone was switched off. He further alleged that these petitioners along with other co-accused have stolen and misused the consignment. It further transpires from the re-statement of the informant that he has contacted the owner of truck who disclosed that his truck is with him and he has not sent any vehicle to Bihar. It is submitted on behalf of prosecution that these petitioners being the transporter along with driver of impugned vehicle have stolen and misused the wheat amounting to Rs. 859561/- and the truck loaded with wheat has not yet been recovered. Specific allegations against these petitioners and investigation against them is at initial stage.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, I am not inclined to give them the benefit of anticipatory bail. Hence, their anticipatory bail petition is **dismissed**. (Dictated)
