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1. Heard Sri Sanjay Kumar Tiwari, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/ petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of thier bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Alleging false implication of the petitioners, it is submitted on their behalf that all the sections invoked in this case are bailable except section 109 and 74 of BNS but there is no allegation of any repetition of blow, thus, as submitted no case u/s 109 of BNS is made out and from the averment in the FIR, no case u/s 74 of BNS is made out and the sole injury sustained by the injured has been opined by the doctor to be simple in nature caused by hard and blunt substance.

4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioners.
5. Heard both the parties and perused the record. It transpires from the perusal of record that petitioners are FIR named & in judicial custody since 08.03.2026. Allegations against them as per FIR are that on the date of occurrence, accused/petitioners have asked the informant to give the papers of her property and when she refused, they abused her & thereafter, assaulted her and her husband. The injury report of informant is attached with case diary showing one lacerated injury over forehead which is simple in nature caused by hard and blunt object. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that a property dispute is going on between the parties and the allegations leveled against the petitioners are general in nature, no specific overt act is alleged against anyone of them. It is further submitted that from the nature of accusation as well as injury report no case u/s 109 BNS is made out against the petitioners and the accusation u/s 74 BNS appears to be super-addition. Petitioners are stated to have no criminal antecedent in para 03 of as mentioned bail petition.
6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances coupled with period of custody undergone, this bail petition of this petitioners are **allowed** and the petitioners are directed to be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties with like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial court.
