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1. Heard Sri Narendra Kumar Singh, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying the recovery of alleged fire arms from the person or place of the petitioners, it is submitted on their behalf that the petitioners are innocent and have been falsely implicated in this case by the police by showing fake recovery of fire arms, however, as alleged the recovery of seized fire arms has been made on 09.03.2026 on the basis confessional statement of accused persons recorded on 10.03.2026 and thus from this facts alone the alleged recovery appears to be fake and imaginary whereas the petitioners have been in jail custody for about two months and thus it is prayed that the petitioners may be released on bail.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioners.

5. Heard both the parties and perused the record. It transpires from the perusal of record that petitioners are FIR named and in judicial custody since 10.02.2026. Allegations against them as per FIR are that on dated 09.03.2026 at around 04:30 PM, the police team of Chand PS got secret information that these petitioners who are accused in Chand PS Case No. 98/2026 are present at their house, the police team reached the spot for verification of information, two persons tried to escape from the house on seeing the police force but they were chased and apprehended & on inquiry, they disclosed their name as Sunil Yadav and Pankaj Yadav (these petitioners) and on their disclosure, two country made weapons along with four live cartridges were recovered from the fodder placed in the field of one Vijaymal Maurya. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 41 of case diary, however, petitioners have mentioned in para 03 of their bail petition that one more case is pending against them in which they are stated to be on bail. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that no fire arm was recovered either from physical possession or conscious possession of these petitioners and the alleged recovery shown by the police was from an agriculture field which is accessible to public at large. It is further submitted that all witnesses of this case are police officials and there is little chance of tempering with evidence.
6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances coupled with period of custody undergone, this bail petition of these petitioners are **allowed** and the petitioners are directed to be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties with like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial court.(Dictated)
