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1. Heard Sri Amit Kumar, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned PP for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying any such occurrence as alleged was ever taken place, it is submitted on behalf of petitioners that both the parties are members of the same family and this case is the outcome of flow of rain water, however, from the face of the FIR itself, the case of the prosecution appears to be concocted one as the source of information made to the brothers of informant by the informant has not been disclosed, moreover, the injuries sustained by the injured persons of are simple and caused by HBS.

4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.
5. Heard both the parties and perused the record. It transpires from the perusal of record petitioners are FIR named and allegation against them as per FIR are that informant has given a loan of Rs. 20,000/- to Petitioner No. 2 and when he ask to return the money on dated 04.03.2026, at around 07:30 PM, these petitioners along with other FIR named accused assaulted the informant and his brothers and injured them. The injury report of all the injured are mentioned in para 20 of case diary showing abrasion and pain which are simple in nature caused by HBS. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent has mentioned in para 15 of case diary. It is submitted that both informant and petitioners belongs to one extended family and they used to quarrel with each other with respect to drainage and common passage and due to this reason this incident was occurred. It is further submitted that allegation against these petitioners are general in nature.
6. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
