ORDER

Date :26.03.2026

1. The above named petitioners seek anticipatory bail in connection with above noted Bhabhua P.S registered for the offence U/s 126(2), 115(2), 109, 3(5) of BNS & 3(1)(r)(s) of SC/ST Act. Heard learned advocate for the petitioners and learned Spl PP for the State.

2. The learned advocate for the petitioners submitted that no regular or anticipatory bail petition on behalf of the petitioners has been filed either in this Court or before honourable High Court, Patna prior to this nor is pending any where. That there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioners. That the prosecution story is totally false and concocted. That the petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence as alleged by prosecution. That all sections areailable save and except 109 BNS which is super addition and not made out against these petitioners. That the informant have given the statement before Bhabhua P.S. and O/C Bhabhua P.S. lodged the FIR as Bhabhua P.S. Case No. 220/2026 u/s 126(2), 115(2), 109, 3(5) of BNS and Section 3(1)(r)(s) of SC/ST Act. That the accused petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case due to enmity and village dirty politics. That there is no injury found on the person of the informant. That these petitioners undertake that they will be abide all the conditions which will be

imposed by this Court while granting bail. That these accused petitioners are local men of means and so the question of their absconding does not arise at all.

3. The learned Spl. PP for the state opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail and submitted that the witnesses in para no. 2, 3, 4 & 5 of the case diary have supported the version of FIR and the petitioners caused multiple injuries to three persons including informant. He further submitted that anticipatory bail is not maintainable due to Bar u/s 18 of SC/ST Act.

4. After hearing both side perused the record and found that Bhabhua PS Case No. 220 of 2026 is registered by the informant Babulal Gond against the petitioners and other accused persons. The witnesses in para 2, 3, 4 & 5 of the case diary supported the version of FIR. Case diary further shows in para 14 injured Babulal Gond suffered injury: Lacerated wound on left temporal region 2"x1/2" and lacerated wound on left thumb 1"x1", in para 15 injured Tinku Gond suffered injury: lacerated wound on right temporal parietal and Abrasion on right hand 1"x 1/2" & in para 16 injured Prahalad Gond suffered injuries: Pain and swelling of left temporal parietal region 2"x2" and Abrasion on right hand wrist 1"x1". Investigation is still pending. Considering the above circumstances, it cannot be prima facie said that no offence under SC/ST Act is committed by the petitioners. Accordingly, the prayer of anticipatory bail of petitioners is dismissed being not maintainable u/s 18 of SC/ST Act.

The observations made in this order are based on material available on record till date and submissions of the parties and shall be confined for the disposal of anticipatory bail application and should not treated as an opinion in the further investigation of the case.
