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1. Heard Sri Rajanikant Patel, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying the allegations levelled against the petitioners it is submitted on their behalf that in fact the father of the informant assaulted and injured petitioner no. 4 for which a case bearing Bhabua PS case No. 193 of 2026 has been lodged against the informant and her family members. Moreover, the allegation of outraging modesty is general and vague and now with the interventions of well wishers of both the parties, they have compromised the case and filed compromise petition.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Heard the arguments of both the parties and perused the case record. It transpires from the FIR that on 27.02.2026 at 7'O clock while the daughter of the informant was going to attend coaching classes, petitioner Nos. 4 and 5 outraged her modesty to which she communicate to the informant and the informant went to complain the matter to their parents upon which the petitioners assaulted mother and brother of the informant and injured them. It is submitted on behalf of the petitioners that both the parties are residents of the same village and this case is the out come of differences cropped up between the parties on trivial issues. Moreover, now the parties have compromised the case and filed compromise petition which is on record. The informant is present in court in person and has stated that she has compromised the case with the petitioners & she has no grievance left against them.
6. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
