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1. Heard Sri Aditya Narayan Prasad, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying any such occurrence as alleged was ever taken place, it is submitted on behalf of petitioners that both the parties are close agnates and this case is the outcome of differences cropped up between female folks of both the parties but exaggerating the facts, this false case has been lodged, moreover, from the facts of the case, no case U/s 75 of the BNS is made out rather the said allegation is super-addition.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
 5. Heard both the parties and perused the record. It transpires from the the perusal of record that Petitioners are FIR named and allegation against them as per FIR are that on dated 03.03.2026 at around 06:00 AM, the daughter of informant when outside the house for defecation, in the meantime, these petitioners caught hold of her and abused her and thereafter, assaulted her. It transpires from perusal of para 7 of case diary that the injured was not medically treated anywhere. Petitioners have no crimi-

nal antecedent as mentioned in para 19 of case diary. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that both informant and petitioners are gotiya patidar and a dispute was occurred between the ladies of both the families and the informant has lodged this case by exaggerating the accusation.

6. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
