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1. Heard Sri Ashok Kumar Verma, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Alleging false implication of the petitioners, it is submitted on their behalf that both the parties are co-villagers and next door neighbours and this case is the outcome of differences cropped up between the parties on trivial issues for which case and cross-case

bearing Karamchat PS Case No. 32/2026 has been lodged, moreover, there is no specific allegation of overt act against the petitioners and the injuries sustained by the injured are simple in nature caused by HBS and thus as submitted no case for the offence U/s 109 BNS is made out and the allegation U/s 74 and 303(2) of the BNS is super-addition.

4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.
5. Heard both the parties and perused the record. It transpires from the perusal of record that petitioners are FIR named and allegation against them as per FIR that on dated 04.03.2026 at around 08:30 PM, all the FIR named accused including these petitioners came to door of informant having lathi, danda etc. in their hands and started abusing her and when her son objected, accused/petitioner Dwarika Singh, assaulted her son with gandas and when she and other family members came to rescue of her son, they were also beaten by the accused persons. Petitioners have also snatched gold chain from her neck. The injury report of the injured are mentioned in para 42, 43 and 47 of case diary showing injuries to them are simple in nature caused by hard blunt object. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 44 of case diary. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that a quarrel was occurred between the parties on date of occurrence in which petitioners side has also received injuries and a cross FIR is lodged by them against the informant side. It is further submitted that from the nature of accusation read with injury report, no case U/s 109 BNS is made out against them and accusation of misbehaving and snatching valuable appears to be super-addition.
6. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
