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1. Heard Sri Ram Dular Singh, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. The case of prosecution is that on dated 22.02.2026 at around 06:00 AM, the informant alongwith his family members were working in their agriculture field, in the meantime, these accused/petitioners alongwith six unknown persons came & accused Anand Singh assaulted Raj Kumar Singh with riffle butt and accused Heera Singh assaulted the informant with riffle butt and injured them and thereafter, Shree Singh also assaulted Daya Shankar Singh with riffle butt and injured him. The accused persons have also beaten Meera Devi and taken away Rs. 50,000/- from the bag of informant.

4. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that they are innocent, have committed no offence and have been falsely implicated in this case due to dirty village politics. It is further submitted that both informant and petitioners are neighbours and a quarrel was broken out between the children of both sides while working in the field and no such incident as alleged was occurred. It is, therefore, prayed that their anticipatory bail petition may please be allowed.
5. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.
6. Heard both the parties and perused the case record. Petitioners are FIR named and allegation against them are that they have assaulted the informant and other persons with riffle butt and injured them. It transpires from perusal of case diary that a quarrel was occurred between the parties on the date of occurrence due to not sending the daughter of informant to her matrimonial house and no such fire arms or weapon was used in the scuffle. It is further submitted no one was seriously injured in the quarrel. Petitioners are stated to have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 03 of their bail petition.
7. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
