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1. Heard Sri Prahlad Singh, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying any such occurrence as alleged was ever taken place, it is submitted on behalf of the petitioners that all the sections invoked in this case areailable except section 353 of the IPC but the ingredient to invoke section 353 of the IPC is completely missing and as such no case for the offence U/s 353 is made out, moreover, due to simple altercation took place between the parties case and counter case bearing Bhagwanpur PS Case. No. 22 of 2024 have been lodged, moreover, there is no specific allegation of overt act and attributed to the petitioners and thus it is prayed that the petitioners may be granted anticipatory bail.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
 5. Heard both sides and perused the record. Petitioners are FIR named and allegation them as per FIR that on dated 20.01.2024 the informant received an information that Urea is loaded in a truck from go-down cum shop of Petitioner No. 2 Bihari Ji Pandey and when informant reached the shop and inspected the stock register and

found 10 sacks of NPK and 48 sacks of urea stored in the shop and when informant asked the petitioners to open the shop for inspection all the FIR named accused started abusing and beating him. Charge-sheet against these petitioners have already been filed and cognizance is taken against them U/s 341, 323, 353, 504, 506, 34 IPC. The injury report of informant is mentioned in para 19 of case diary showing pain & swelling which simple in nature caused by HBS It further transpires from perusal of para 34 of case diary that these petitioners were given benefit of section 41(a) Cr.PC during investigation and they have not violated the condition of bond since then. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 11 of the case diary.

6. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
