1. Heard Sri Sanjay Kumar Tiwari, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/ petitioner and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioner has stated in para 2 of his bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Denying allegations levelled against the petitioner, it is submitted on his behalf that this case is the outcome of matrimonial dispute moreover, the petitioner is still ready to keep and maintain the victim in all respect, however, the allegations against this petitioner is general, vague and omnibus whereas the injuries sustained by the injured are on non-vital part of the body.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for granting bail to the petitioner.
 5. Heard the arguments of both the parties and perused the case record. Its a matrimonial dispute. Petitioner is the husband of informant. He is in judicial custody since 22.02.2026. Allegations against him as per FIR are that informant got married to this petitioner on dated 29.05.2020 and after sometime of marriage, this petitioner started harassing and torturing the informant for demands of dowry and when she refused, he started beating her and finally move her out of matrimonial house on dated

14.02.2026. She further alleged that this petitioner is a drug addict and sold all her jewelry and or purchase of drugs. It is submitted on behalf of petitioner that good relation between husband and wife is established. Further, informant in present in court and stated that she has no grievance left against the petitioner and now ready to live with him. Petitioner is stated to have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 3 of his bail petition.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances and that petitioner is in judicial custody for more than seven weeks, this bail petition is **allowed** and the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on his furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties with like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial court.
