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1. Heard Sri Madan Mohan Singh, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/ petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Claiming themselves to be innocent, it is submitted on behalf of petitioners that both the parties are co-villagers and this case is the outcome of differences cropped up between the parties for which case and cross case bearing Ramgarh PS case no. 57/2026 have been lodged by both sides against each other, moreover, all the sections invoked in this case are bailable except section 74 of BNS but there is no specific allegation of overt act against the petitioners.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Heard the arguments of both the parties and perused the case record. It transpires from the perusal of record that petitioners are FIR named and allegations against them as per FIR are that on dated 28.02.2026 at around 07:30 AM, all the accused petitioners came to the house of informant having lathi, danda, hasua etc. in their hands and started abusing and beating the ladies of the house of informant and injured them. The injury report of the injured are attached with case diary showing one lacerated wound on head to Mira Devi and to Sanju Devi and rest injured have pain and swelling, all the injuries are simple in nature caused by hard and blunt object. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 14 of case diary. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that a quarrel was occurred on the date of occurrence between the women of both the families in which both sides have received injuries and cross case is lodged by them against each other. It is further submitted that allegations against these petitioners are general and omnibus and from the nature of accusation, no case under section 74 BNS is made out against them.
6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
