The present miscellaneous petition has been filed by the petitioner/ wife against the respondent/husband under <i>Section 144(3) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (herein after referred to as ‘the BNSS’)</i> for enforcement of the maintenance order. 3. Today, both the petitioner and respondent are physically present before this Court. With the intervention of the Court and their respective counsels, the parties have arrived at an amicable and unequivocal agreement to settle the grievance raised in this petition. 4. In terms of mutual agreement, the respondent/husband has undertaken to pay a total sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) per month to the petitioner/wife. The said amount is bifurcated as follows : “Rs. 5,000/- towards the current monthly maintenance as awarded by this Court, and Rs. 5,000/- towards the liquidation of the outstanding arrears of maintenance”. The respondent/husband shall deposit the aforementioned total amount of Rs. 10,000/- directly into the bank account of the petitioner/wife on or before the 10th day of each succeeding month. The petitioner/ wife has expressed her willingness to accept this arrangement and has provided her bank account details for the same. 5. In view of the statements made by both the parties before the Court and the agreement reached between them, the Court is satisfied that the grievance in the present miscellaneous petition stands

Accordingly, instant miscellaneous petition is hereby DISPOSED OF AS SATISFIED. No order as to costs. 6. However, liberty is reserved to the petitioner/wife to file a fresh petition in the event the respondent/husband fails to make the agreed payments for two consecutive occasions. 7. The parties shall remain bound by their statements made before this Court today. 8. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of as well.
