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1. Heard Ramjanam Singh, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. Alleging false implication of the petitioners, it is submitted on their behalf are that the petitioners are innocent and have been falsely implicated in this case whereas there is no specific allegation of overt act against the petitioners and this case is the outcome of differences cropped up between the parties on trivial issues for which case and cross-case bearing Ramgarh PS Case No. 104 of 2026 has been lodged.
 4. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners.
 5. Heard both the parties and perused the record. It transpires from the perusal of record that the petitioners are FIR named and allegation against them as per FIR are that on dated 08.04.2026 at around 10:00 PM, the informant along with his associates were returning to his village on a four wheeler and when they reached around 01 kilometer from the village, a stone was thrown on the vehicle and eight boys having country made weapon surrounded the vehicle and damaged the wind shield of the vehicle thereafter, they dragged the informant and his associates from the vehicle and beaten them and taken away valuables and cash from their pocket. He further alleged that

these petitioners were identified by him. The injury report of both the injured are attached with case diary showing body pain which is simple in nature caused by HBS. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 44 of case diary. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that a quarrel was occurred between the parties due to rashly and negligently driving the four wheeler by the associate of informant and hit the motorbike of petitioners due to which they fell down and sustained serious injuries. It is further submitted that a cross-case is also lodged by father of Petitioner No. 01 regarding this incident bearing Ramgarh PS Case No. 104 of 2026.

6. Considering the aforesaid fact and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
