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1. Heard Sri Nand Kishor Prasad, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners and Sh. Sachidanand Rai, learned P.P. for State.
 2. Petitioners have stated in para 2 of their bail petition that no other bail petition, either anticipatory or regular has been filed/pending except this, either in this court or before Hon'ble High Court at Patna.
 3. The case of prosecution is that on dated 07.12.2025 at around 01:00 PM, the husband of informant went to his agriculture field at dam for land dispute, but the accused persons including these petitioners were already present at the place of occurrence having lathi danda etc. in their hands and were cutting the paddy crop and when informant & her family members objected, all of them started beating the informant and others in which Tarkeshwar Bind, Suman Bind, Jitendra Bind and Upendra Bind received serious injuries and the husband of informant Tarkeshwar bind died due to injuries received by him.
 4. Ld. Counsels for the petitioners have submitted that they are innocent, have not committed any offence and have been falsely implicated in this case due to village politics and previous enmity. It is further submitted that informant and petitioners belongs to common lineage and a land dispute is going on between them. It is further submitted that informant and her family members have assaulted the petitioners in which Tarkeshwar Bind was also injured for which Ramgarh PS Case No. 374/2025 was lodged by the petitioners against informant's family members. It is further submitted that allegations against these petitioners are general and omnibus,

no specific overt act is mentioned against their name. It is further submitted that co-accused of this case are granted anticipatory bail by Hon'ble High Court, Patna vide order dated 08.04.2026 in criminal misc. no. 19759/2026 and the case of these petitioners are of similar footing. It is, therefore, prayed that this bail petition may please be allowed.

5. Learned PP has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
6. Heard the arguments of both the parties and perused the case record. It transpires from the perusal of record that petitioners are FIR named and allegations against them are that they along with other FIR named accused have brutally assaulted the husband of informant and other family members and injured them and the husband of informant collapsed due to aforesaid injuries. Charge sheet against of co-accused has already been filed. The post mortem report of the deceased Tarkeshwar bind is attached with case diary showing bruise present on the skull and blood coming out of mouth and the cause of death is hemorrhage and shock due to above mentioned injuries which was caused by hard, blunt and heavy object and ante mortem in nature. The injury report of other injured are also attached with case diary showing injuries to them are simple in nature except one injury to Upendra Bind over right palm and on right foot to Jitendra Bind which are grievous in nature. It is submitted on behalf of petitioners that a quarrel was occurred between the parties on the date of occurrence related to old property dispute for which cross case is lodged by them against each other and petitioners side have also received injuries in the quarrel. It is further submitted that the deceased has only one bruise injury over his head and there is no specific overt act mentioned against these petitioners either in FIR or statement of witnesses mentioned in case diary. Petitioners are stated to have no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 3 of their bail petition.
7. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, this anticipatory bail petition is **allowed** and in the event of their arrest or surrender within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, these petitioners shall be released on bail on their furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of trial court, subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the BNSS.
