SESSIONS JUDGE-II, KAIMUR AT BHABUA <u>Anticipatory Bail Petition No. 1225 of 2026</u> Sanu Kumar @ Sanu Chaurasiya V/s State An anticipatory bail petition No. 1225 of 2026 filed on behalf of the accused-petitioner namely Sanu Kumar @ Sanu Chaurasiya and another ABP No. 1271 of 2026 filed on behalf of Ashutosh Kumar Singh both are arising out of Mohania P.S Case No. 428 of 2026, registered for the offence U/s 126(2), 324(4), 352, 351(2), 3(5)BNS & 27 of Arms Act, heard together. Copy of bail petitions have duly been served to Id. A.P.P. Heard learned counsel Sri Ramesh Kumar and Sri Amresh Kumar Sigh on behalf of the petitioners respectively and learned APP for the State. Prosecution story in short is that, on 11.06.2026 at about 04:30 PM when the informant was sitting on his shop 6-7 persons armed with weapons unlawfully entered into the shop and damages property of CSP. while damaging property the petitioner stating " My name is Sanjeev Kumar, I am son of Daya Singh, and reside in Mohania itself; no one shall disclose the incident to anyone, nor shall the CCTV footage be revealed. They damaged the property of CSP worth of Rs 2 top 2.5 lakh. Out of them one tried to made fire from sixer but not succeeded. Lastly when public gathered there they fled away. Learned counsel for the accused petitioners submit that they are quite innocent and have committed no offence whatsoever. Earlier petitioners have not filed any bail application either in this court or any superior court. There is nothing specific against any of these petitioners. Petitioners are not named in FIR. Nothing has been recovered from the possession of petitioners. Co-accused has been enlarged on bail. On the basis of above facts Id. counsels for the accused petitioners submit that they are entitled for anticipatory bail. On the contrary Id. counsel for the prosecution has vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail. Heard both the sides. Perused the case record, it transpires that petitioners are not named in FIR. The main accused namely Sanjeev Singh has been granted bail on the basis of compromise. Petitioners case stand on better footing. Considering these facts, both petitioners Sanu Kumar @ Sanu Chaurasiya and Ashutosh Kumar Singh are directed to be released on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender on furnishing bail-bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to satisfaction of the court below within four weeks from the receipt of copy of this order.
