**ORDER**

**08.05.2026-** This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on the behalf of accused-petitioner namely 1. Mausam Singh who is apprehending his arrest in connection with aforesaid case.

Heard the ld. counsel Shri Ujjwal Kumar Singh appearing on the behalf of the petitioner and Ld. A.P.P. Shri Md. Azaj Alam on the behalf of the state.

According to F.I.R. prosecution case in nutshell is that on alleged date of occurrence informant namely Md. Mushtaq was doing work of plaster of wall at that time accused petitioner namely Mausam Singh made firing upon informant with view to take his life away and bullet hit at his back. Later on informant was taken to Sadar hospital Katihar where bullet was taken out from his body.

On the other side learned counsel for the petitioner has reiterated all the grounds taken in the bail petition and has submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and he has committed no offence at all and he has falsely been implicated in this case by the informant of this case. He has further submitted that as per F.I.R. it is quite clear that the petitioner fired upon the bird through his airgun but with any intention the cartridges injured the informant and there is no any intention or motive of the petitioner for this injury. He has further submitted that the case has already been settled and compromise has taken place in between both the parties. Accused-petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. Accordingly, it has been prayed to allow the said anticipatory bail petition.

Per contra, learned A.P.P. has vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Heard the both parties and perused the case record from perusal of the case record it is evident that any bullet part has not been taken out from the body of informant rather pointed articles just like a small keel has been taken out from the body of informant. So it is quite clear that petitioner has not used any fire arms rather he has used some other arms. Moreover, injury sustained by informant has been reported to be simple in nature caused by pointed object and

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case has been compromised between both the parties and joint compromise petition is on record.

So having consideration the above facts and submission made by the Ld. Counsel for the petitioner, the instant anticipatory bail petition is hereby allowed and accordingly it is ordered to release the petitioner namely Mausam Singh on bail in the case of surrender/arrest within three weeks of this order on furnishing of bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned subject to the condition as mentioned in the section 482(2) of the B.N.S.S..
